

In this specialization, students learned all the skills needed to write, perform, and record original music. They began by learning how to play the guitar to accompany themselves in Guitar for Beginners. They learned how to play chords and scales, as well as strumming patterns and finger picking patterns. In Singing Popular Music, they developed their own personal style. They learned how to sing properly and mastered the correct techniques and breath support. From there, they honed their writing craft, focusing on lyrics. They learned about stressed and unstressed syllables, rhyme schemes, and lyrical phrasing. They also worked with a Digital Audio Workstation, focusing on Ableton Live, capturing both MIDI and real instruments to record and share their ideas with the world
